



## 9-1-1 AND OTHER IMPORTANT EMERGENCY NUMBERS

*Knowing how to call for help and receive up to date emergency information can help save lives.*

**If you must call 9-1-1**, speak clearly, and do not hang up until the dispatcher has received and recorded all needed information. If possible, use a landline phone.

Cell phone calls to 9-1-1 may go to the California Highway Patrol (CHP) in Vallejo and are then routed to the appropriate local jurisdiction. To avoid delay, pre-program your cell phone with the local Emergency Dispatch numbers and other important numbers listed below.
